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## INTRODUCTION

The sample size of **(478)** four hundred and seventy eight were used in this research. **458** delegate and **20** non delegates.

The constituency was divided into three (3) zones namely:

**Anum Apapam zone,**

**Asuboi Zone and**

**Coaltar Zone respectively.**

## THE RESEARCH OBJECTIVES.

The objectives for this particular research are as follows:

1. To identify a credible candidate who can win the primaries and eventually the 2024 elections for the people of **Ayensuano**.
2. To assess the weakness and the strength of the incumbent **MP HON.NANA YAW TEDDY**.
3. To get fair ideas from the Delegates and their understanding of constituency primaries elections.
4. To solicit the views of delegates about what they look out for in their parliamentary candidates.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The sample size of **(478)** four hundred and seventy eight respondents were used in this research. **458** respondents (delegates) and **20** respondents (non-delegates).

The constituency was divided into three (3) zones namely:

**Anum Apapam zone,**  
**Asuboi Zone and**  
**Coaltar Zone respectively.**

This research is about **Ayensuano NDC constituency primaries elections.**

The Ayensuano constituency NDC in the Eastern Region has a current sitting member of parliament in the person of **Hon. Nana Yaw Teddy Saforo Addy.**

As a result, this exercise was carried out to ascertain his level of performance and popularity within his own party and other potential aspirants. Namely:

**Hon. Eric Owusu Dampsey (Agenda 2020)**

**Hon. Ruth Dela Sedoh**

The team used a period of **twenty one (21)** days to embark on this exercise. It commenced on the **23rd March, 2023** and ended on the **13th April, 2023.**

The team relied on the sample size of four hundred and seventy-eight **(478)** respondents who are also delegates and non-delegates: Thus **four hundred and fifty-eight (458)** are delegates with number of **twenty (20)** being non- delegates.

The survey showed that most people were not happy about the performance and behaviour of the sitting MP. However, despite different opinions about the conduct of the incumbent MP, majority of the delegates expressed interest to vote for him in the upcoming elections.

Mr. Eric Owusu Dampsey (Agenda 2020) is also another possible candidate delegates may consider depending on his messages and strategies outlined for the party and by extension the constituency.

## ABSTRACT

The purpose of this research is to identify the characteristics that makes a candidate successful in winning the primaries and ultimately becoming the victorious in the parliamentary election of 2024.

The study utilizes a mixed method approach including both qualitative survey and qualitative interviews.

Participant were delegates and political analysts. The survey focused on democratic information and interviews to identify a candidate that stands out from the rest.

The study was delimited to mostly delegates in the Ayensuano constituency. Delegates from all the three zones were used as respondent in conducting the research.

Limitation of the study includes time to conduct the research, difficulty in dealing with some delegates because of their understanding on research and the access to some of the communities.

Target population refers to the empirical units such as person, object or occurrences used for the study. That is the group of interest to the research. The target population was delegates in the Ayensuano constituency

In view of the target population a sample and sampling procedure was adopted.(Kombo,2006) argued that a representation sample of 10% and above is enough for providing the required information in a large population of 1,117 delegates in the constituency 458 were interviewed.

The research instrument that was used was questionnaires. The items in the questionnaires was structured such that they enabled respondents to pick alternatives answers against their choice of response. With the **data collection procedure**, the researcher sought permission from the constituency executives. Also, group of people were to interview the respondent at convenient place, date and time.

During the administration, delegates were briefed on the objectives of the study and need to respond frankly to the items. Confidentiality was assured.

For the analysis, descriptive and analytic methods were used. The data collection method was very extensive and as such was analyzed quantitatively.



# BACKGROUND TO THE STUDY

## AYENSUANO CONSTITUENCY {DISTRICT}

This piece of writing or research is about the Constituency known as Ayensuano Constituency (District) in the Eastern Region of Ghana. Ayensuano District is one of 260 Metropolitan, Municipal and District Assemblies in Ghana and form part of the thirty-three (33) Municipalities and Districts in the Eastern Region of Ghana.

### **LOCATION/ LANDSIZE:**

The district lies within 50 45 1 N and 60 5 1 N and longitudes 00151 W and 0045W and it is located in the Southern part of the Eastern Region with a total land area of 499km<sup>2</sup>. With its administrative capital as Coaltar, Ayensuano was carved from Suhum-Kraboia Coalter and form part of the new Districts and Municipalities, created in the year 2012 and were inaugurated at their various locations simultaneously on the 2<sup>nd</sup> June, 2012 by Legislative Instrument 2025.

### **BOUNDARIES:**

It shares boundaries with the mother District Suhum Municipality the North, Nsawam-Adoagyiri Municipality to the South, Akuapem South District and West Akim Municipality to the West.

### **POPULATION:**

According to 2021 population and housing Census, Ayensuano District Assembly stands at 94,594 in words **ninety four thousand five hundred and ninety four** with 47,161 male and 47,433 females. The recent National voter registration exercise carried by electoral commission of Ghana In 2020 showed that the voter population of Ayensuano stand at 57,487(fifty-four thousand) plus eligible voters registered.

### **OCCUPATION:**

The people of the above mentioned District or Constituency are predominantly farmers.

### **PEOPLE/ ETHNICITY:**

Generally, the Ayensuano District could be described as an Akan Traditional area, however, the constituency could also be said to be relatively cosmopolitan because there are other non-Akan tribes like Ewe, Ga-Adamgbe, etc. and other group of people with different ethnic or cultural diversities settled in the District.

### **PROBLEM:**

It is important to note that the constituency is faced with lots of problems or challenges. Notable amongst these numerous challenges in the constituency include Bad or Dilapidated roads, unemployment for the youth, poor infrastructure for schools, Toilets (sanitation), inadequate health facilities, lack of incentives for farmers, poverty and high illiteracy rate.

## METHODOLOGY

The research team used strategies and methodologies like administering of questionnaire sample views and interviews.

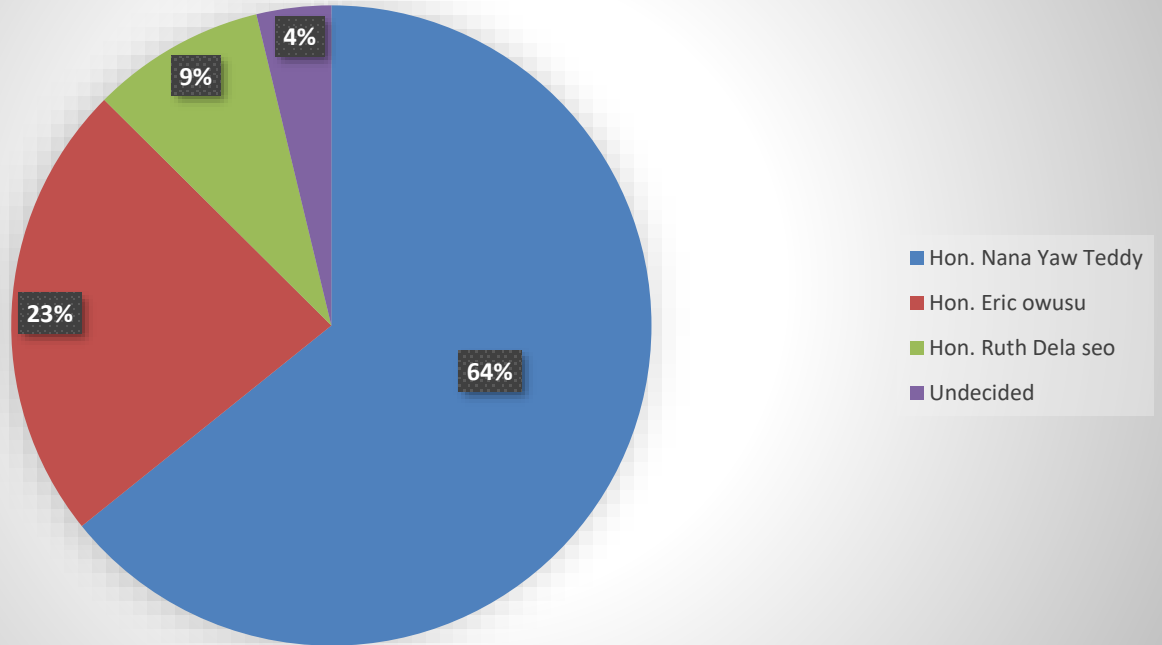

## REPRESENTATION OF FOUR KEY QUESTIONNAIRES USING PIE CHART AND BAR CHART (p 1/2)

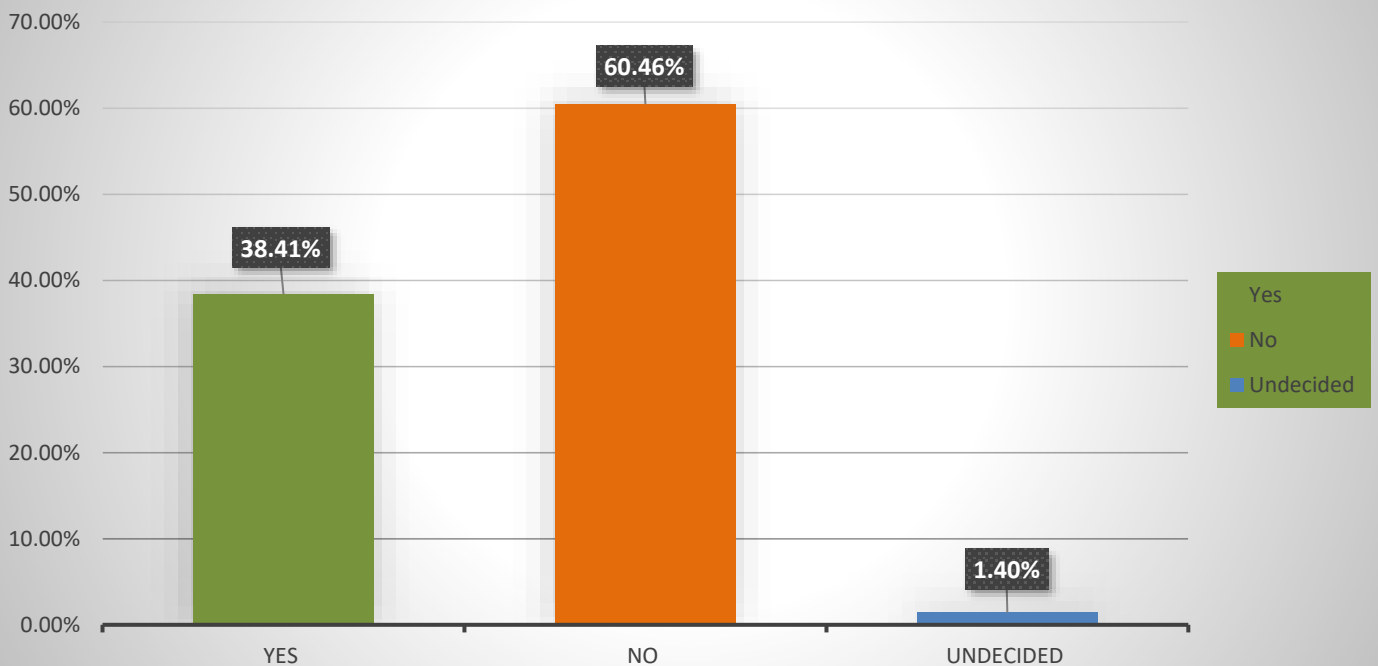
**Q5. Which of them do you think can win the primaries election?**

**Q6. Should the current MP be changed as parliamentary candidate?**

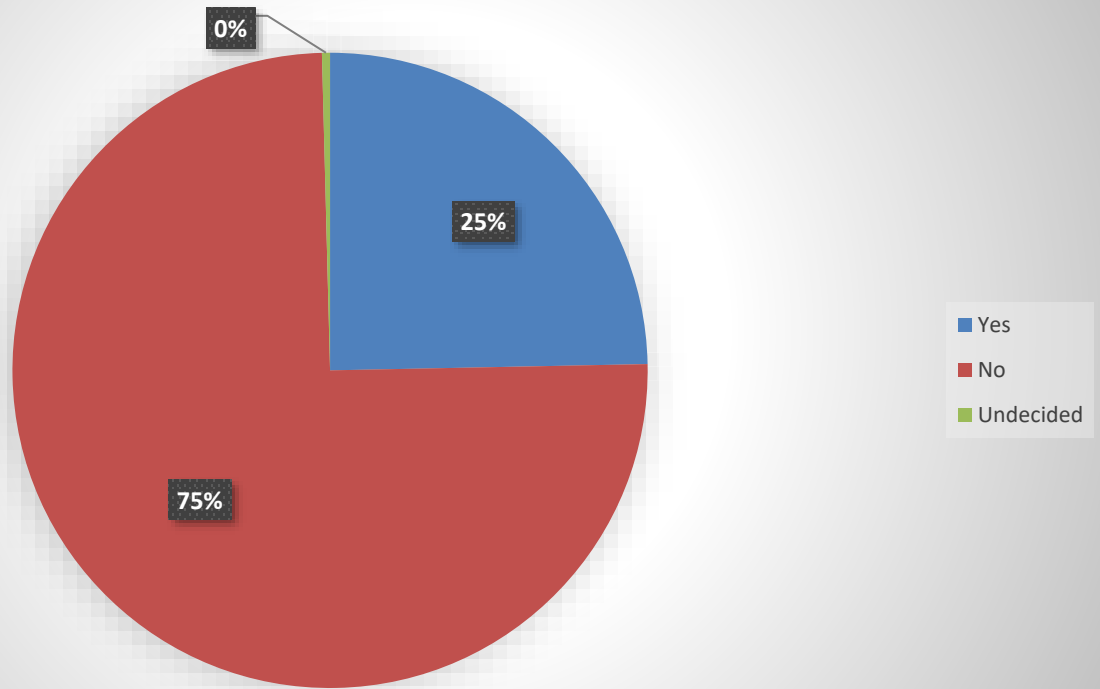

# REPRESENTATION OF FOUR KEY QUESTIONNAIRES USING PIE CHART AND BAR CHART (p 2/2)

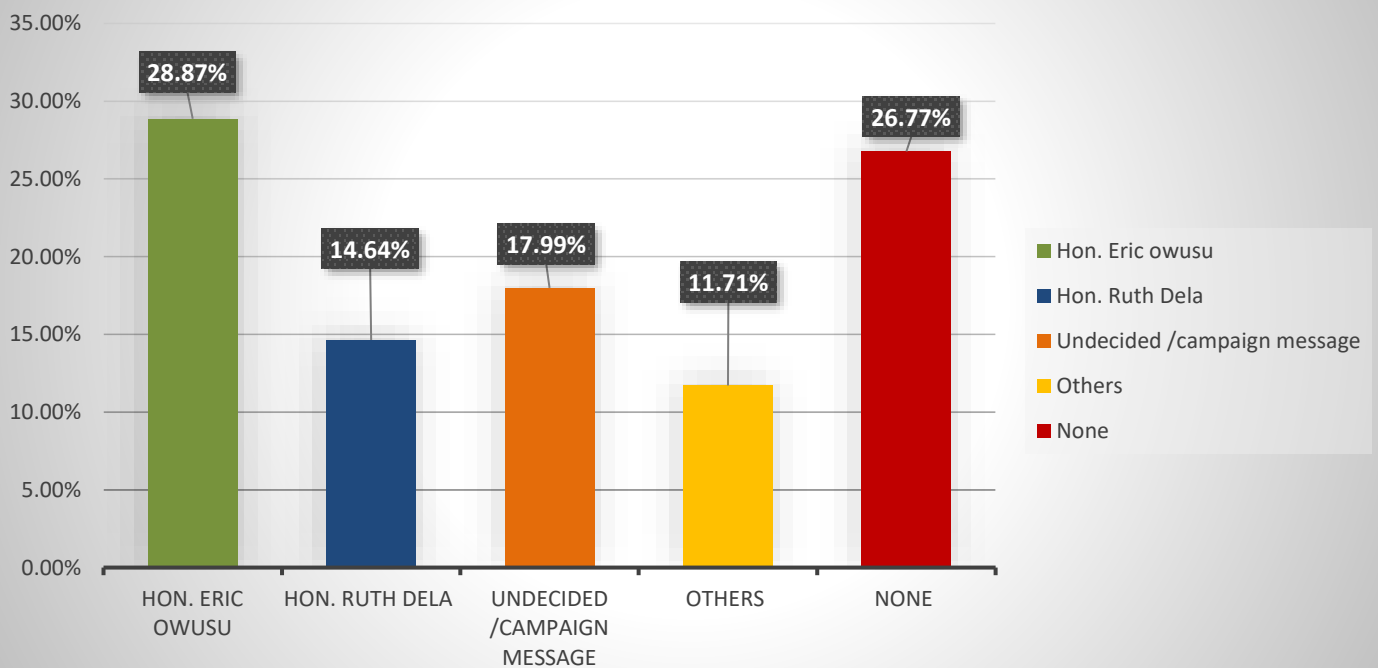
**Q7. Do you think the incumbent MP should unopposed without him being contested**

## DETAILED ANALYSIS OF RESPONDENTS

From the survey conducted, four hundred and seventy eight (**478**) delegates and non-delegates were the sample size used for this research. Four hundred and fifty eight (**458**) delegates and twenty (**20**) non-delegates. The research team visited various communities within the constituency to solicit their views on the upcoming NDC constituency primary elections.

From the table above, in question one (1) two (2), all four hundred and fifty eight the 458 respondents (delegates) responded **yes**, they are delegates and twenty (20) respondents said **no**, non-delegates.

From table 3,

- **462** respondents representing **96.65%** said they know the names of the candidates contesting in the primaries.
- **16** respondents representing **3.35 %** said they do not know the names of candidates contesting in the primaries.

Most respondents were able to list the names of the candidates who have openly declared their intentions to participate in the primaries. Names mentioned frequently were :

**Hon. Nana Yaw Teddy**

**Hon. Eric Owusu Dampsey (Agenda 2020)**

**Hon. Ruth Dela Sedoh**

With regards to the questionnaires 5, which reads “**which of them do you think can win the primaries election?**”

- **307** respondents representing **64.22 %** said they think **Hon. Nana Yaw Teddy** can win the primaries election.
- **111** respondents representing **23.01 %** said **Hon. Eric Owusu Dampsey** can win the primaries.
- **42** respondents representing **8.7 %** said **Hon. Ruth Dela Sedoh** can win the primaries.
- **18** respondents representing **3.7 %** said they have **not decided** on who can win the primaries.

Another questionnaires which asked the question “**should the current MP be changed as Parliamentary candidate?**”

- **184** respondents representing **38.41 %** said **Yes**, the MP must be changed.
- **289** respondents representing **60.46 %** said **No** the current MP should not be changed.
- **5** respondents representing **1.04 %** said they have **not decided** on that.

On the question of “**Do you think the incumbent MP should go unopposed without him being contested in the primaries?**”

- **118** respondents representing **24.68 %** said **Yes**, the sitting MP should go unopposed.
- **358** respondents representing **74.89 %** said **No**, the MP must be contested and not allowed to go unopposed.
- **2** respondents representing **0.41 %** said they **cannot say** anything about that.

On the performance of the sitting MP, Hon. Nana Yaw Teddy, the following statistic were given to rate his performance.

- **107** respondents representing **22.38 %** rate his performance as **Excellent**.
- **224** respondents representing **46.86 %** rate his performance as **Average**.
- **141** respondents representing **29.49 %** also rate his performance as **Poor**.
- **6** respondents representing **1.25 %** said they **cannot say** anything about his performance.

Subsequently, the question of “**Do you think Ayensuano needs female Parliamentary Candidate going into 202?**”.

- **128** respondents representing **26.77%** said **Yes**, the constituency **needs a female candidate**.
- **340** respondents representing **71.12 %** said **No**. they **do not need female candidate** for 2024 Election.
- **10** respondents representing **2.09%** said they **cannot give** an opinion to that.
- **5** respondents representing **1.5 %** said they are **waiting** for her **campaign message**.



The research team also asked an interesting question to know the delegates thought on *Skirt and Blouse* vote pattern. As a result of that.

- **147** respondents representing **0.75 %** said **Yes**, they believe in *Skirt and Blouse* vote pattern.
- **326** respondents representing **68.20 %** said **No** they do not subscribe to *Skirt and Blouse* vote pattern.
- **5** respondents representing **1.04 %** said they are undecided.

On the popularity of the aspirants, the 478 questionnaires administered, the following were the statistics

- **354** respondents representing **74.05%** said **Hon. Nana Yaw Teddy** is the most popular.
- **58** respondents representing **12.1 %** said **Hon Owusu Damphey (Agenda 2020)** is the most popular.
- **60** respondents representing **12.5 %** said **Hon. Ruth Dela Sedoh** is the most popular.
- **4** respondents representing **0.82 %** said they **cannot tell**.
- **2** respondents representing **0.42 %** said they want a **new face**.

Delegates who are respondents to this research were also asked “which of these candidate can win the seat in 2024, the following were the results.

- **268** respondents representing **56.06 %** said **Hon. Nana Yaw Teddy** can win the seat.
- **123** respondents representing **25.73%** said **Hon Owusu Damphey (Agenda 2020)** (Agenda 2020) can win the seat.
- **43** respondents representing **8.9%** said **Hon. Ruth Dela Sedoh** can win the seat in 2024.
- **6** respondents representing **1.2 %** said any **new face** can win.
- **18** respondents representing **3.7 %** said they are **undecided**.
- **20** respondents representing **4.1 %** said they are **waiting** for the **campaign message** before they can make a choice.

The penultimate question (13) which seek to solicit the views of the delegates in which of the candidate that can perform much better than the incumbent MP.

- **196** respondents representing **41 %** said **Yes**, there are **other candidates** that can perform better than **Hon. Nana Yaw Teddy** the incumbent MP.
- **262** respondents representing **54.81 %** said **No**, there is **no other candidates** who can perform much better than the incumbent MP.
- **18** respondents representing **3.76 %** said they have **not decided** on that.
- **2** respondents representing **0.41 %** said they are **waiting** for **campaign message**.
- **18** respondents representing **3.7 %** said they are **undecided**.
- **20** respondents representing **4.1 %** said they are **waiting** for the **campaign message**.

Subsequently question (14) which was the final questionnaire, and follow up question to question 13, the following were the analysis

- **18** respondents representing **28.87 %** said **Hon Owusu Damphey (Agenda 2020)** can perform much better.
- **70** respondents representing **14.64 %** said **Hon. Ruth Dela Sedoh** can perform much better.
- **56** respondents representing **11.71 %** said (Agenda 2020) said any other candidate can perform better.
- **86** respondents representing **17.99 %** said they cannot tell who can perform better.
- **128** respondents representing **26.77 %** said none of them can perform better

## CONCLUSION

The group **Young Thinkers Network For Development** who did this research, **in their view**, could predict that if NDC constituency primary elections was conducted as at **15<sup>th</sup> of April (Second week in April) 2023**, **Hon. Nana Yaw Teddy** the incumbent MP for Ayensuano would be retained by delegates as Parliamentary candidate for 2024 elections.

The delegates would have voted for him although most delegates or respondents interviewed expressed different opinions about **him**. The next candidate or aspirant delegates would vote for is **Hon Owusu Damphey (Agenda 2020)**, **Hon. Ruth Dela Sedoh** in that order.

## KEY FINDINGS

The research team by name **Young Thinkers Network For Development** were on ground to embark on this important exercise to know the various candidate namely:

**Hon. Nana Yaw Teddy Saforo Addy.**

**Hon. Eric Owusu Dampsey (Agenda 2020)**

**Hon. Ruth Dela Sedoh**

Who have expressed interest and desire to contest in the NDC CONSTITUENCY primary elections.

Consequently, after **carefully listening to the views** of some delegates and few non delegates in the constituency the following observations were made:

- All delegates expressed greater interest and passion to vote in the primaries. The team would like to acknowledge that as at time of administering questions there was a ban on the constituency and other **26 constituencies** for the primaries. But nevertheless delegates showed a greater interest to vote in the primaries if there were no such directives.
- The group identified some delegates whom we named as **undecided group**.
- Some delegates told the research office that they are **waiting for the campaign message** from aspirants before they can decide.
- The team noticed that delegates were not too happy about the performance of the current *MP. Nana Yaw Teddy*.
- Most respondents told the research officers that, the MP had not been attending to them and worst of all is his inability to pick their phone calls.
- The group Young Thinkers also saw that although delegates complains about the MP, they are willing to vote for him in the primaries.
- It was also interesting to note that the delegates didn't like the idea of candidate going for unopposed.
- Although, the survey suggests that Hon. Nana Yaw Teddy is preferred candidate by the delegates, Hon. Eric Dampsey (Agenda 2020) could make impact depend on the messages he deliver to candidates and the vision he shares with them.
- Also Hon. Ruth Dela Sedor, position as Deputy National Youth Organizer made her name known to the constituency.

## RECOMMENDATION

The following are some of the recommendation the team **Young Thinkers Network For Development** have identified and therefore recommends them for swift actions:

- Aspirants must have a **strong campaign message** for the delegates.
- Aspirants must understand the **real problems** of *Ayensuano* and suggest possible ways of solving them when given the nod by the party delegates.
- Aspirants must make it a point to identify the **undecided group** so that they can give them a convincing message to make their decision.
- Aspirants must spell out their **clear vision** for delegates, the party and the entire constituency what they can do differently from what their predecessors have done in the past in the constituency.
- We also recommend to **aspirant's money** will play a critical or major role in the primaries.
