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## INTRODUCTION

The sample size of 325 three hundred and twenty five respondents (delegate) were used in this research.

The constituency was divided into three (3) zones namely :

Anum Apapam zone,

Asuboi Zone and

Coaltar Zone respectively.

## THE RESEARCH OBJECTIVES.

The objectives for this particular research are as follows:

1. To identify a credible candidate who can win the primaries and eventually the 2024 elections for the people of Ayensuano.
2. To assess the weakness and the strength of the incumbent MP HON.NANA YAW TEDDY.
3. To test the understanding of delegates in relation to the developmental works done by the current DCE Hon. Josephine Awuku Ansaah Inkoom since her assumption of office.
4. To get fair ideas from the Delegates and their understanding of constituency primaries elections.
5. To solicit the views of delegates about what they look out for in their parliamentary candidates.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The sample size of **(325)** three hundred and twenty five respondents (delegates) were used in this research. The constituency was divided into three (3) zones namely:

**Anum Apapam zone,  
Asuboi Zone and  
Coaltar Zone respectively.**

This research is about **Ayensuano NPP Orphan constituency primaries elections.**

The Ayensuano constituency NPP in the Eastern Region has no member of parliament.

The former **MP Hon Samuel Ayeh Payeh** lost his seat to the current Member of Parliament in the person of **Hon. Nana Yaw Teddy** in the 2020 general election with a vote difference of **241**.

As a result, this exercise was carried out to identify a credible candidate who can win the primaries and eventually the 2024 election for the people of Ayensuano. Also the exercise was carried out to ascertain the level of performance of the sitting MP.

As at the time this survey was being conducted the potential aspirants were:

**Hon. Samuel Ayeh Payeh**

**Hon. Ernest Addo**

**Hon. Ida Adwoa Aseidua**

**Hon. Mark Okraku Mantey (Deputy Minister for Tourism, Art and Culture) and**

**Hon. Josephine Awuku Ansaah Inkoom (D.C.E for Ayensuano Assembly)**

The team used a period of **twenty one (21)** days to embark on this exercise. It commenced on the **27th February, 2023** and ended on the **20th March, 2023**. The team relied on the sample size of three hundred and twenty five (**325**) respondents who are all delegate. **The survey showed that most people were willing to vote for a female candidate.** Hence majority of the respondent who are also the delegate expressed interest to vote for **Madam Ida Adwoa Asiedua**.

In addition most respondent were also satisfied with the performance of the current **DCE Hon Josephine Awuku Ansaah Inkoom** since her assumption of office. **Hon Samuel Ayeh Payeh, Hon Ernest Addo** were **Hon Mark Okraku Mantey** were also possible candidate delegates may consider based on their message and strategies outlined for the party and by extension the constituency.

## ABSTRACT

The purpose of this research is to identify the characteristics that makes a candidate successful in winning the primaries and ultimately becoming the victorious in the parliamentary election of 2024.

The study utilizes a mixed methods approach including both qualitative survey and qualitative interviews.

Participant were delegates and political analyst. The survey focused on democratic information and interviews to identify a candidate that stands out from the rest.

The study was delimited to mostly delegates in the Ayensuano constituency. Delegates from all the three zones were used as respondent in conducting the research.

Limitation of the study includes time to conduct the research, difficulty in dealing with some delegates because of their understanding on research and the access to some of the communities.

Target population refers to the empirical units such as person, object or occurrences used for the study. That is the group of interest to the research. The target population was delegates in the Ayensuano constituency

In view of the target population a sample and sampling procedure was adopted.(Kombo,2006) argued that a representation sample of 10% and above is enough for providing the required information in a large population of **669** delegates in the constituency **325** were interviewed.

The research instrument that was used was questionnaires. The items in the questionnaires was structured such that they enabled respondents to pick alternatives answers against their choice of response. With the Data collection procedure the researcher sought permission from the constituency executives and group of people were to interview the respondent at convenient place, date and time.

During the administration, delegates were briefed on the objectives of the study and need to respond frankly to the items. Confidentiality was assured.

For the analysis, descriptive and analytic methods were used. The data collected method were very extensive and as such was analyzed quantitatively.



# BACKGROUND TO THE STUDY

## AYENSUANO CONSTITUENCY {DISTRICT}

This piece of writing or research is about the Constituency known as Ayensuano Constituency (District) in the Eastern Region of Ghana. Ayensuano District is one of 260 Metropolitan, Municipal and District Assemblies in Ghana and form part of the thirty-three (33) Municipalities and Districts in the Eastern Region of Ghana.

### **LOCATION/ LANDSIZE:**

The district lies within 50 45 1 N and 60 5 1 N and longitudes 00151 W and 0045W and it is located in the Southern part of the Eastern Region with a total land area of 499km<sup>2</sup>. With its administrative capital as Coaltar, Ayensuano was carved from Suhum-Kraboia Coalter and form part of the new Districts and Municipalities, created in the year 2012 and were inaugurated at their various locations simultaneously on the 2<sup>nd</sup> June, 2012 by Legislative Instrument 2025.

### **BOUNDARIES:**

It shares boundaries with the mother District Suhum Municipality to the North, Nsawam-Adoagyiri Municipality to the South, Akuapem South District and West Akim Municipality to the West.

### **POPULATION:**

According to 2021 population and housing Census, Ayensuano District Assembly stands at 94,594 in words **ninety four thousand five hundred and ninety four** with 47,161 male and 47,433 females. The recent National voter registration exercise carried by electoral commission of Ghana In 2020 showed that the voter population of Ayensuano stand at 57,487(fifty-four thousand) plus eligible voters registered.

### **OCCUPATION:**

The people of the above mentioned District or Constituency are predominantly farmers.

### **PEOPLE/ ETHNICITY:**

Generally, the Ayensuano District could be described as an Akan Traditional area, however, the constituency could also be said to be relatively cosmopolitan because there are other non-Akan tribes like Ewe, Ga-Adamgbe, etc. and other group of people with different ethnic or cultural diversities settled in the District.

### **PROBLEM:**

It is important to note that the constituency is faced with lots of problems or challenges. Notable amongst these numerous challenges in the constituency include Bad or Dilapidated roads, unemployment for the youth, poor infrastructure for schools, Toilets (sanitation), inadequate health facilities, lack of incentives for farmers, poverty and high illiteracy rate.

## METHODOLOGY

The research team used strategies and methodologies like administering of questionnaire sample views and interviews.

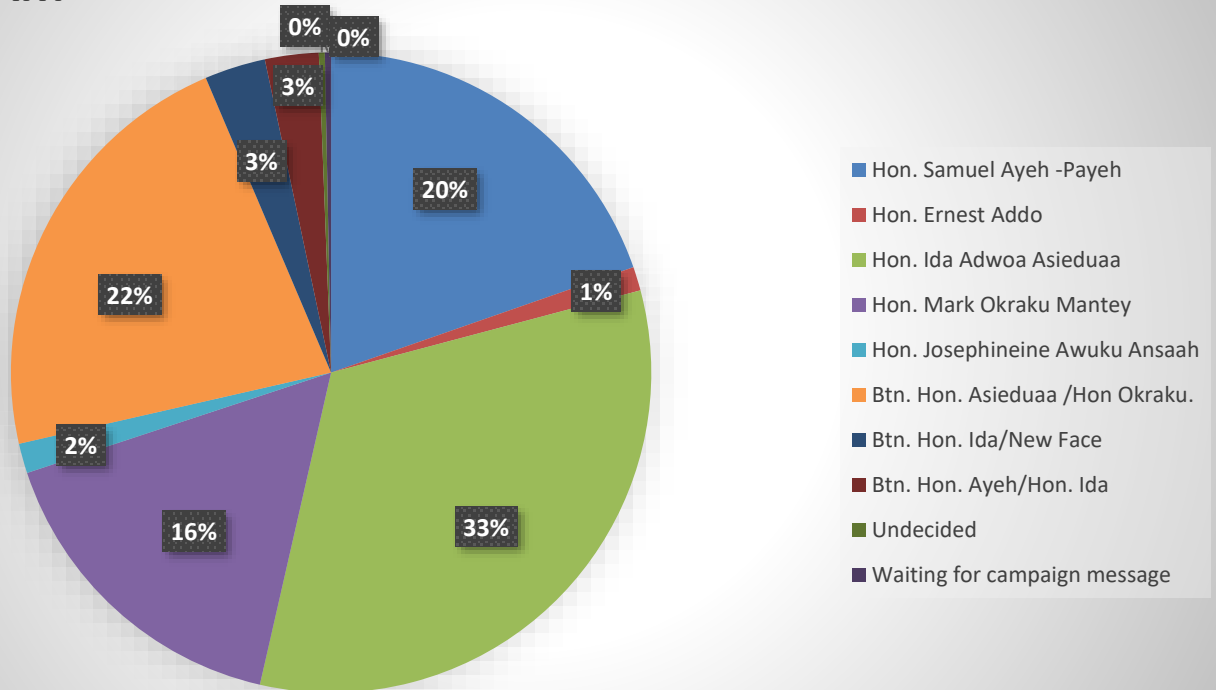

### REPRESENTATION OF FOUR KEY QUESTIONNAIRES USING PIE CHART AND BAR CHART (p 1/2)

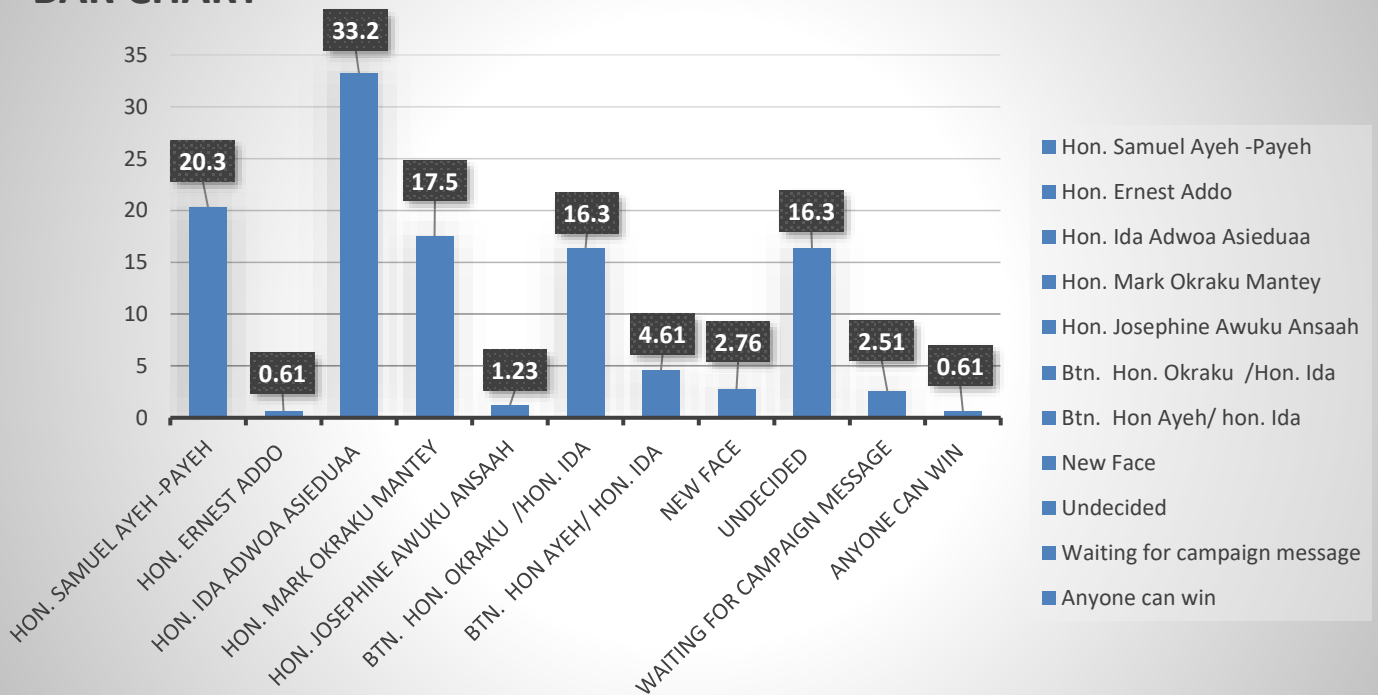

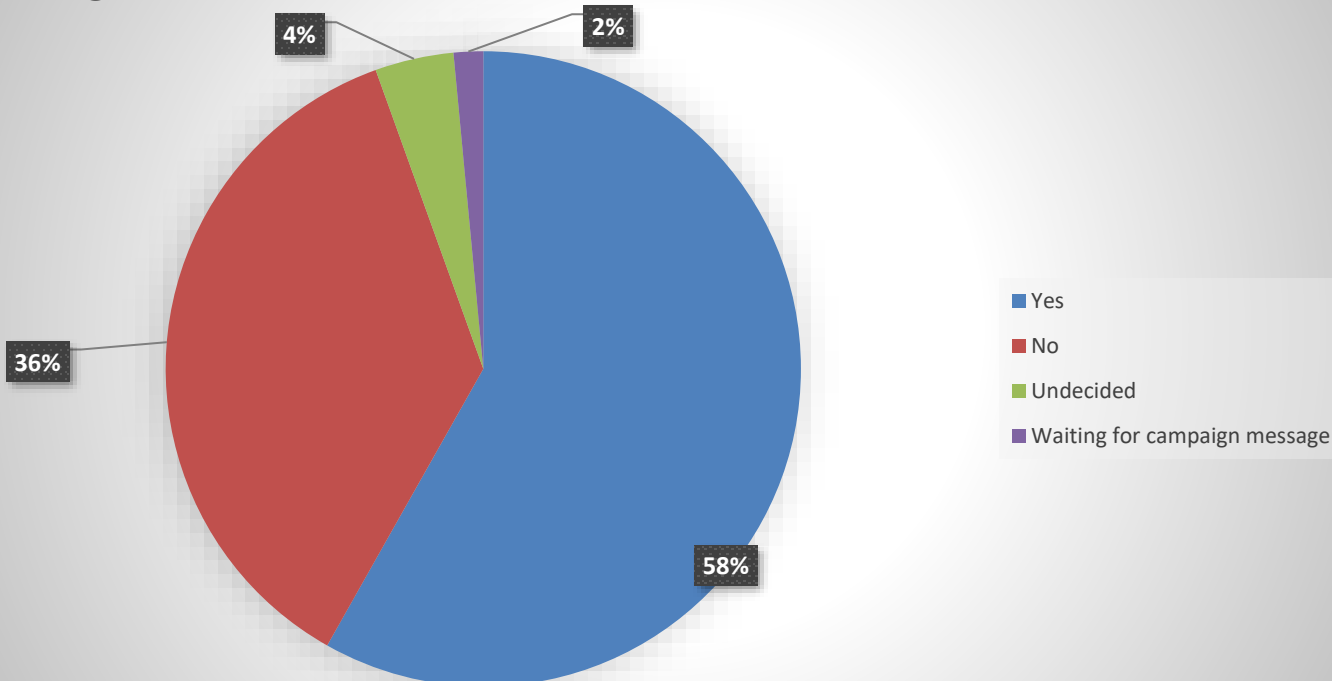

# REPRESENTATION OF FOUR KEY QUESTIONNAIRES USING PIE CHART AND BAR CHART (p 2/2)

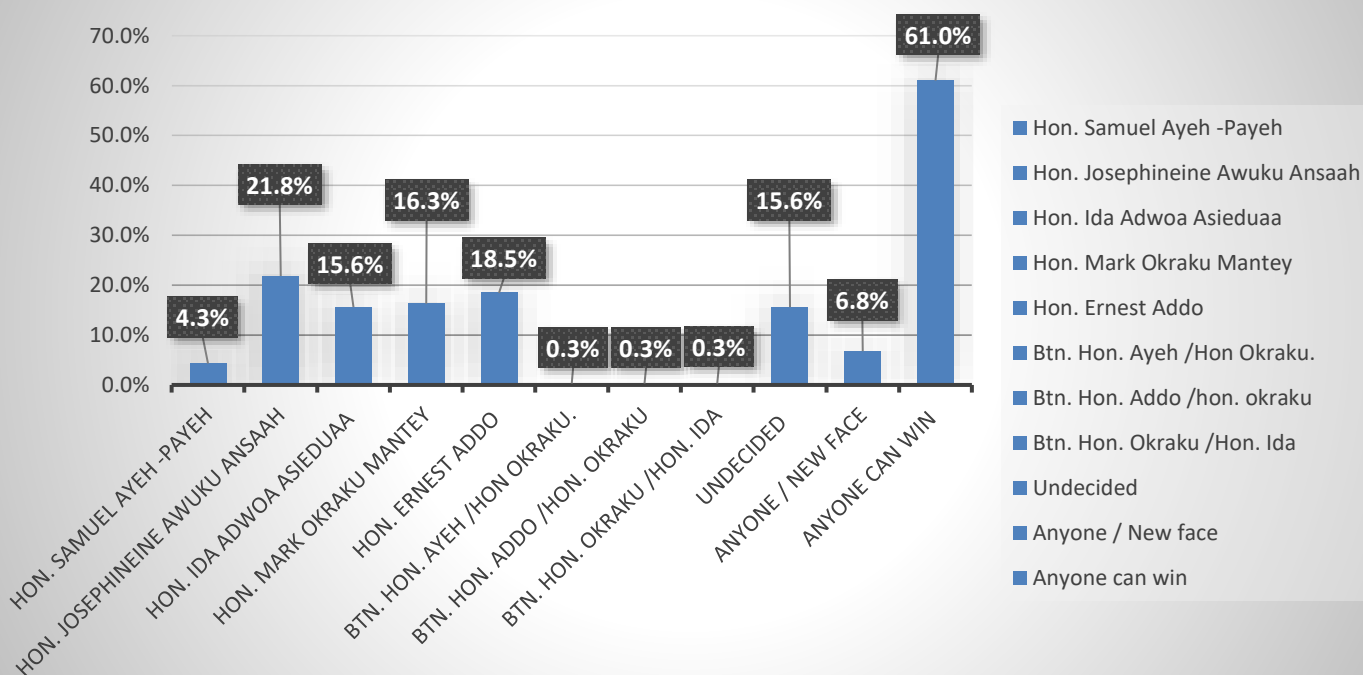

## DETAILED ANALYSIS OF RESPONDENTS

From the survey conducted, three hundred and twenty five (325) delegates were the sample size used for this research. Also thirty five (35) non delegates were interviewed in the various communities that the team visited to solicit their views on the upcoming NPP constituency primary elections.

From the table above, in question one (1), all 325 respondents responded **yes**, they were delegates. Some respondents said they are aware of the upcoming primaries.

The respondent also admitted that they know the names of the candidates contesting in the primaries.

Most respondent were able to list the names of the candidates who have openly declared their intention to participate in the primaries. Names mentioned frequently were **Hon. Ida Adwoa Asiedua, Hon. Okraku Mantey, Hon. Ayeh Payeh, Hon. Ernest Addo and Hon. Josephine Awuku (DCE)**, based on assumption because she has not openly declared her intention to contest.

With regards to the questionnaire 5, which read “Which of them will you vote as the delegate?”

- **64** respondents representing **19.6%** said they will vote for **Hon. Samuel Ayeh Payeh.**
  - **4** respondents representing **1.4 %** said **Hon Ernest Addo,**
  - **106** respondents representing **32.6%** said **Hon Ida Adwoa Asiedua,**
  - **53** respondents representing **16.3 %** said **Hon Mark Okraku Mantey,**
  - **5** respondents representing **1.5%** said **Hon Josephine Awuku Ansaah.**
- Also there was a group of respondents the research team categorised them as undecided / cannot tell people.
- **72** respondent representing **22.1%** said they have not decided on whom to vote for.
  - **10** respondent representing **3.07%** said they are waiting for the campaign message from each of those candidates before they can make a decision of whom to vote for.
  - **9** respondents representing **2.7%** ticked either **Hon. Asiedua Ida** or **Hon. Mark Okraku Mantey.**
  - **1** respondents representing **0.3 %** said new face or said either **Hon Samuel Ayeh Payeh** or **Hon. Ida Asiedua.**

All questionnaires have detailed analyses from the table above. All the percentages terms and the number of respondents responding to a particular questionnaire have been given in the various tables above.



On the question of “**Do you know the name of your current DCE?**”

- **308** respondents representing **94.76%** said they know her name, in the person of **Hon. Josephine Awuku Ansaah Inkoom**.
- **17** respondents representing **5.23%** said they do not know the name of the current **DCE**.

It was interesting to know, from the survey, the team observed that most of the respondents, who are delegate were happy or impressed with the works of the **DCE** so far.

- **269** respondents representing **82.7%** said they are impressed with the work of **DCE**.
- **156** respondents representing **17.24%** responded negatively to the works or performance of the **DCE**.

From table nine (9) which also was question nine (9) was an assumption question in direct relation to the **DCE Hon. Josephine Awuku Ansaah**, it was revealed that although she has not made formal declaration to contest,

- **189** respondents representing **58.15%** said they will vote for her should she contest in the primaries.
- **118** respondents representing **36.30%** said **No**. they will not vote for her.
- **13** respondents representing **4%** said they have not decided.
- **5** respondents representing **1.5 %** said they are waiting for her campaign message.

From question 10. Most respondents responded that they would vote for her (**DCE**) based on her performance. Some indicated that she has done well compared to the other previous **DCEs** in the district. However, some were also on the views that she hasn't done much for them to see.

Another interesting questionnaire which was designed to ascertain the true picture of the incumbent member of the parliament for Ayensuano, Hon. Nana Yaw Teddy gave the following statistics as follows:

- **3** respondents representing **0.92 %** said **yes** the **MP** has delivered the needs of the constituent.
- **322** respondents representing **99.08** said the **MP** has not delivered the needs to the constituents.

Subsequently, the question of how would you rate the performance of the sitting **MP**.

- **100** respondents representing **30.7%** said he has performed abysmal,
- **222** respondents representing **68.3%** describe his performance as failure and
- **3** respondents representing **0.92** said he has performed averagely.

The penultimate question (14) which seek to solicit the view on the delegates on which of the **NPP** Parliamentary candidate do you think can win the seat back from the **NDC** to **NPP** in 2024.

- **66** respondents representing **20.3%** said **Hon. Samuel Ayeh Payeh**.
- **3** respondents representing **0.92%** said **Hon. Ernest Addo**, ‘
- **116** respondents representing **35.6%** said **Hon Ida Adwoa Asiedua**,
- **49** respondents representing **15.07%** went in for **Hon. Mark Okraku Mantey**.
- **16** respondents representing **4.92%** said the **DCE Josephine Awuku** ,
- **51** respondents representing **15.6 %** said they haven’t decided yet or they can’t say anything for now.

The research further revealed the group or respondents who said **Anybody can win** the seat,

- **19** respondents when translate who percentage of **5.84 %** said anyone can win the seat.
- Then **5** respondents who could not choose between **Hon. Ida Adwoa Asiedua** and **Hon. Mark Okraku Mantey** representing **1.53%**.

The last questionnaire for the research, which was administered to know a candidate who could be neutral and appealing to both delegates and the general voters of Ayensuano.

- **71** respondents representing **21. 84%** said **Hon. Josephine Awuku Ansaah (DCE)** would be **neutral**,
- **53** respondents representing **16. 30%** said **Hon. Mark Okraku Mantey**,
- **14** respondents representing **4.30%** said **Hon Samuel Ayeh Payeh**,
- **60** respondents representing **18. 45%** said **Mr Ernest Addo** ,
- **51** respondents representing **15.6%** said **Hon. Ida Adwoa Asiedua**.
- Another **51** respondents representing **15.6 %** said they haven’t decided or cannot tell their stance now.
- **22** respondents representing **6.70%** of the total respondents of 325 said anybody or new candidate with new face can win the seat in 2024.
- Also **1** respondent representing **0.30%** said it could be **Hon. Mark okraku / Hon. Ayeh Payeh**.
- Another **1** respondent representing **0.30%** said it could be **Hon. Ernest Addo / Okraku** .
- **Finally 1** respondent representing **0.3** said its either **Hon. Okraku or Hon. Ida Adwoa Asiedua**.

## CONCLUSION

The group **Young Thinkers Network For Development** who did in this research in their view, could say that if NPP constituency primary elections were conducted as at mid of March 2023, *Madam Ida Asiedua* would have been the possible candidate to win the parliamentary seat for *Ayensuano*. The delegates would have voted for her compared to all other candidates. Per the facts on the ground of the research analysis the next candidate they would have considered is *Hon. Samuel A. Payeh*, followed by *Hon. Mark Okraku Mantey* and *Hon. Josephine Awuku Ansaah (DCE)* and lastly **Hon. Ernest Addo**.

However, the group vehemently could predict that the analysis above could change, when the *Hon. Josephine Awuku Ansaah Inkoom (DCE)* finally, declares her intention to contest the *Ayensuano NPP primaries*. The situation may **entirely** change.

## KEY FINDINGS

The research team by name *Young Thinkers Network for Development* were on the grounds to embark on this important exercise to know the various candidates who have expressed themselves the interest and desire to contest in the NPP constituency primary elections

After carefully listening to the views of some delegates and few non delegates in the constituency, the following observations were made:

- All delegates expressed greater interest and passion to vote in the primaries.
- The group identified some delegates whom we named as **undecided** delegate.
- Some respondents (delegates) told the research officers that they are waiting for the campaign message from the aspirants before they can decide
- We also noted some delegate are of the view that whoever the party chooses to represent them can win the general elections.
- From the analysis, some delegates have expressed interest to vote for *Madam Ida Adwoa Asiedua* however, most delegates also made a profound statement that they would vote for *Hon. DCE. Josephine Awuku Ansaah* if she declare her intention to contest so to continue with her good works so far.
- The group also observed that majority of the delegates are impressed and convinced with the works of the *DCE* so far, since her assumption of office.
- The team also observed that delegates are willing to vote for a female candidate. Thus from this perspective we have *Madam Ida .A. Asiedua* and *Hon. DCE. Josephine Awuku Ansaah*.

## RECOMMENDATION

The following are some of the recommendations the team identified:

- Aspirants must have a strong campaign message for the delegates.
- Aspirants must understand the real problems of *Ayensuano* and suggest possible ways of solving them when given the nod by the party delegates.
- Aspirants must make it point to identify the undecided group so that they can give them convincing message for them to make an inform decision.
- Aspirants must spell out their clear vision for delegates and the entire constituency what they can do differently from what their predecessors have in the constituency.
- We recommend that whoever will emerge as winner must try to work with other to foster strong unity in the constituency to avoid skirt and blouse vote pattern as in the case of 2020 elections.
